Relaxing in African style

Africa Safari South Serengeti is a comfortable accommodation, located in the Ngorongoro Conservation Area and offers easy access to the crater, while at the same time being on the south side of Lake Ndutu, which is in the Serengeti National Park. The best of both worlds! The nearby airstrip offers connections to the other major airstrips and airports. The area is famous for the calving season of the Great Migration, an absolute highlight of the annual wildebeest migration. The short rains in November and December provide nutritious pastures for the wildebeest, which stay in the area until the end of the long rains. Most calves are born in January and February. The open grassy plains offer them some safety, but these young wildebeest attract hungry predators, such as lions, leopards, cheetahs and hyenas. Between April and November, the south-eastern plains dry out, but there is still an abundance of game in the area. There are in fact two water sources, Lake Masek and Lake Ndutu, where many wild

animals come to drink. The area around Lake Ndutu is also famous for being home of 6 species of big cats (lion, cheetah, leopard, serval, African wild cat and caracal) which are present throughout the year. The 12 accommodations (6 Safari Comfort and 6 Luxury Glamping) form two wings with a restaurant tent and a bar/lounge tent in the middle. The classic safari tents are fully furnished with locally made furniture and have an ensuite bathroom. There are also 5 Safari Tents available, with shared toilet and shower facilities.

Throughout the year there is an abundance of wildlife in the area, which makes it perfect for game drives.

When you are on your way from the Serengeti to the Ngorongoro Crater/ Lake Manyara or vice versa, you will pass the Ndutu area. From the border of Serengeti National Park/Ngorongoro Conservation Area it is only a 32 km drive, to Africa Safari South Serengeti close to Lake Ndutu, through a landscape full of Acacia trees.

Serengeti National Park

With vast open plains and an abundance of wildlife as far as the eye can see, the Serengeti is a safari maker's dreamland. Because the park is so vast, it is advisable to spend several days exploring. Serengeti National Park stretches over 14,763 square kilometres and is easily the largest and perhaps the most popular of the Northern Circuit's National Parks. Serengeti is host to the Great Wildebeest Migration, when some six million hooves walk across the open plains, as more than 200,000 zebras and 300,000 Thomson's gazelles accompany the wildebeest on their journey to fresh grass. Serengeti's Seronera area is located in the south-central region of the park and is known for a large number of big cats; the lion, leopard and cheetah are often spotted here. But also the elephant, giraffe, hippo, crocodile, buffalo and impala are also well-known inhabitants. The area is very popular because it is one of the most likely places to see a hunt. The landscape is dotted with "kopjes", rocky granite or Gneiss protrusions, more than 550 million years old and highly loved by some cats as lookouts during the hunt.

Ngorongoro Crater

Nothing can prepare you for the breathtaking beauty of Ngorongoro Crater. Standing on the viewpoint and beholding the crater, the clouds floating around the crater rim with a cool, mountainous breeze in the air, there is no mistaking the divinity of Mother Nature. Ngorongoro Crater is a world heritage site, the world's largest intact volcanic caldera and is widely referred to as the 8th Wonder of the World. Due to its natural boundaries, there is an abundance of wildlife in the protected area which is home to the Big Five including the African black rhino, but you will also find hyenas, zebras and elephants to name but a few. The Ngorongoro Crater is an absolute must on any northern tour.

NDUTU AREA

The south-eastern part of the Serengeti, the Ndutu area, is rich in wildlife all year round, but wildlife numbers reach a peak between December and April. Huge herds of wildebeest and zebra are attracted by the seasonal rains. In this period, the best area for game viewing is the plains around Lake Ndutu, where the wildebeest herds are concentrated. Most calves are born in January and February, some 8,000 per day. The short grass plains offer them some safety, as predators can be spotted more easily. Nevertheless, as happens in nature, these young wildebeest attract many hungry predators, such as lions, cheetahs, leopards and hyenas. Other species such as gazelles and zebras also give birth and use the wildebeest calves as cover to divert attention from their own young.

The area also caters for birdwatchers; the Thorny Tree forests are the habitat of yet other birds and if you pay attention you may see the fantastically coloured Fischer's Lovebird.

NDUTU AREA

Ndutu area covers a large area of the southern part of the Serengeti, as well as a large section of the Ngorongoro Conservation Area, Africa Safari South Serengeti is located in the Endulen region on the border of these two magnificent wildlife areas, with a lot of different game drive possibilities. Endulen is home to the Laetoli prehistoric site.



Activities

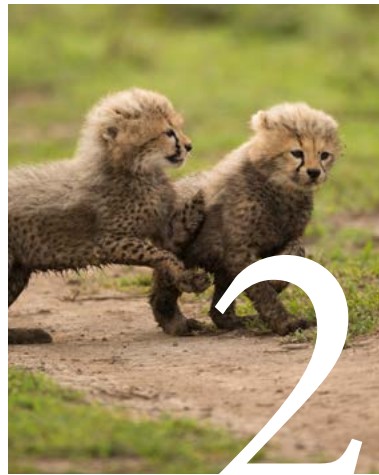
MATITI PLAINS

The Matiti Plains is the main plain where the wildebeest calve from January to March. The Serengeti Twin Hills overlook this plain. This is where the pregnant wildebeest gather; open terrain and unobstructed views. Newborn calves can be on their feet within 7 minutes. They have to, because this area is also home to cheetahs and other big cats, which means lots of interaction between prey and predator.



GOL KOPJES

The Gol Kopjes offer some of the best game viewing in Africa during the green season. This area has the highest concentration of cheetahs in Africa. Hundreds of tracks criss-cross the world-famous Gol Kopjes complex and the photographic opportunities are endless. With a little patience, there is a good chance of seeing a cheetah reach high speeds while chasing its prey.



THE TRIANGLE

With no permanent water source, much of the wildlife here can only survive during the green season. This is when the Triangle is a fantastic feeding ground with nutritious short grass for a staggering number of migrating herbivores, including wildebeest, zebra, gazelle and the large and small predators that follow the migrating herds. Later in the season, the area dries out and the grass withers, making it less attractive to wildlife.



Things to see

OLDUVAI GORGE

Learn about archaeology, history and the earliest humans at Olduvai Gorge, or Oldupai (correct Maasai spelling). Olduvai Gorge is a water-carved ravine located in the eastern Serengeti Plain within the Ngorongoro Conservation Area. The gorge is particularly famous for the rich treasure of human and animal fossils found there. Few places in the world can match its long human history and this fact has earned this part of Africa the title of "cradle of humanity".

OLDUVAI GORGE MUSEUM

The museum was founded by Mary Leakey and is managed by the Ngorongoro Conservation Area Authority. The museum is located in the Ngorongoro Conservation Area on the edge of Olduvai Gorge. It is a museum offering insight into and information about Olduvai Gorge and the Laetoli fossils. There are two halls; one focuses on Olduvai and the other on Laetoli. The exhibitions at Olduvai Gorge Museum focus on paleoanthropological research and artefacts from the area. Historical objects from the Olduvai Gorge area are exhibited, as well as maps and diagrams explaining the process of fossil excavation. Many of the artefacts are original, but some are casts. In the room dedicated to the petrified footprints of Laetoli, a cast made in 1996 by the J. Paul Getty Museum of part of the footprint is on display. There are also several maps and photographs that describe and illustrate the process of creation of Laetoli's footprints. In addition, there is a large illustration showing three Australopithecus afarensis walking through the area 3.6 million years ago.

Safari Jeep

Four-wheel drive safari jeep with a pop-up roof for hire on request, including driver and fuel. Your driver guide is very knowledgeable and will make sure to give you as much time as you need to ask questions, take pictures and enjoy the incredible landscape.

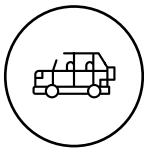

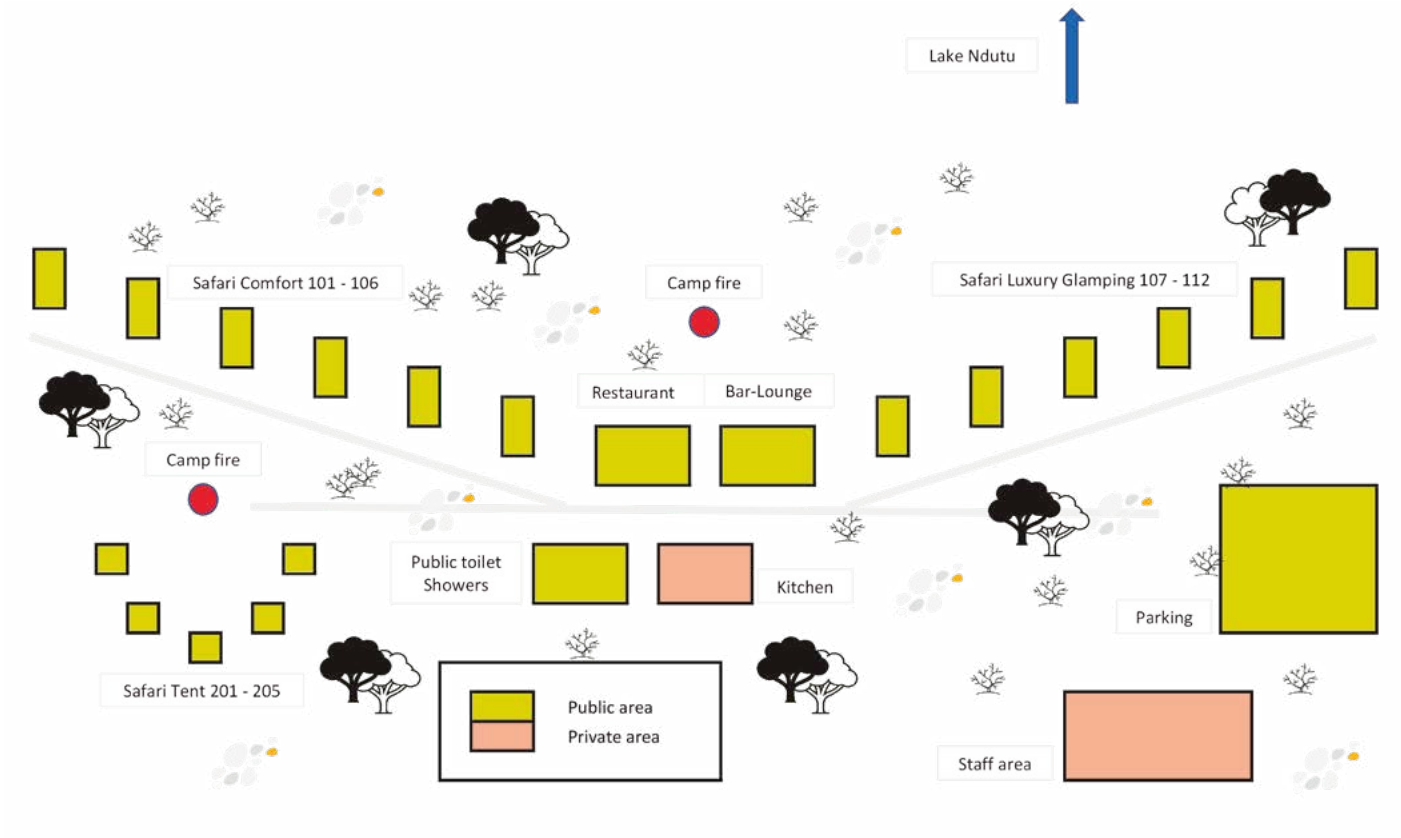

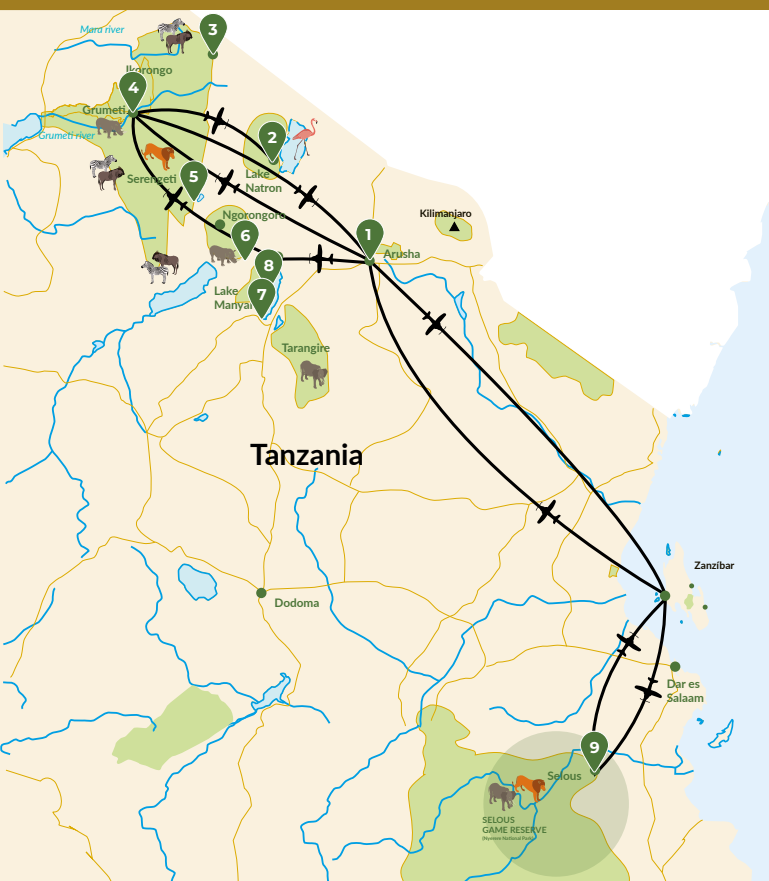
